

**2006 Oregon Long Range High Power Rifle Championship**  
**Sponsored by Snake River Sportsmen**

**DATE:** September 9 and 10, 2006.

**DIRECTIONS TO RANGE:** The SRS outdoor range is located approximately two miles south of Vale, Oregon on Lytle Blvd. Standard highway signs to the range are located on the west end of town and on Lytle Blvd (Glenn Street in Vale).

**COMPETITION OPEN TO:** All NRA members, also competitors must be a member of the Oregon State Association or to a State Assoc. that has a reciprocal agreement with the Oregon State Association. **This is a Registered Tournament.** All competitors must comply with NRA rule 1.6(f). To qualify for any award OSSA members and competitors from other states must show their state association membership card. Memberships will be available at the match. Some awards, including Governors Ten and State Distinguished, are only available to Oregon State Residents. Please bring your identification. If you forget your identification(s) a temporary membership can be purchased and your check will be torn up as soon as current membership is verified.

**ENTRIES CLOSE:** Advance registration ends September 8, 2006. Post entries will be accepted up to the range limit provided that they do not delay the match or require additional relays. Payment need not be made in advance, but is requested. Do not send cash through the mail. Payment will be accepted at the range. **ADVANCE ENTRIES ARE REQUESTED.** The range limit is 45 competitors.

**CLASSIFICATION:** NRA classification will be used in all matches. rule 19.6 or 19.2 may be used.

**RIFLES ALLOWED:** NRA Match Rifle (rule 3.3) or NRA Service Rifle (rules 3.1 - 3.1.1 - 3.1.2)  
**New - Rule 5.7 F-Class Prone - F-Class Prone** is fired from the prone position. The rifle may be supported with a rear and/or front rest (see rule 5.2) while aiming and firing. (See rule 3.2 for type of rifle.)

**NOTE:** F-Class competitors are not eligible for National Records or awards and prizes except for those specifically listed for F-Class in the match program.

**SIGHTS:** Metallic Sight, Match # 4, 5, Any Sight, Match # 1, 2, 3.

**TARGET:** 1000 Yd. LR Target

**REGISTRATION:** Range registration at 8:00 AM, Saturday, September 9, 2006

**Firing Starts:** at 9:00 AM Saturday, September 9, 2006  
at 8:00 AM Sunday, September 10, 2006

**MATCH SCHEDULE:**     MATCH #1 ANY RIFLE - ANY SIGHT, Saturday

20 record shots at 1000 yards - 30 minute time limit including unlimited sighter shots prior to the first record shot. Scorer must be notified before the first record shot. No sighter shots after the record string of fire begins.

MATCH #2 ANY RIFLE - ANY SIGHT, Saturday

**RULES:** Current NRA High Power Rules will apply. You will be required to use an open bolt indicator at this match. (I will have some for sale.)

**ENTRY FEE:** Entry fee is \$14.00 per match or \$50.00 for all matches. This includes a \$5.50 NRA registration fee and a \$2.00 Oregon State High Power fund fee.

**CHALLENGE FEE:** \$2.00 per challenge and will be collected on the line.

**TARGET PULLERS:** Competitors will be required to pull targets.

**SCORING:** Competitors will be required to score.

**AWARDS:** NRA Awards per schedule below:

MATCH 1 - 5

MATCH WINNER---6 points

1ST IN CLASS----- 5 points

2ND IN CLASS----- 4 points

3RD IN CLASS----- 3 points

4TH IN CLASS----- 3 points

F-CLASS WILL COMPETE AS A SEPARATE CATEGORY IN EACH OF THE FIVE MATCHES AND WILL FIRE ANY SIGHT IN MATCHES 4 AND 5. (For the Aggregate Special Awards the F-Class will only be eligible for the Dr. Mike Carny F-Class Award.)

SERVICE RIFLE WILL COMPETE AS A SEPARATE CATEGORY IN EACH OF THE FIVE MATCHES.

There will be one award for each five competitors in a class, i.e. 1 to 5 = 1 award, 6 to 10 = 2 awards, 11 to 15 = 3 awards, 16 to 20 = 4 awards.

If there are fewer than 5 competitors per class, competitors may be combined with the next higher class. If fewer than 5 High Masters enter, they will compete for Match Winner only.
